The Medical Library is located on the IUPUI Campus which is located just west of Downtown Indianapolis

From Michigan Street (one-way street going west)

- Take Michigan Street to University Blvd.
- Turn right (heading north) on University Blvd.
- W. Walnut Street is the first street on the left after passing IU Hospital
- You will see the elevated train tracks of the Clarian People Mover turning onto W. Walnut Street

From New York Street (one-way street going East)

- Take New York Street to University Blvd.
- Turn left (heading north) on University Blvd. until you pass Michigan Street
- The IU Hospital will be to the left
- W. Walnut Street is the first street on the left after passing IU Hospital
- You will see elevated train tracks of the Clarian People Mover turning onto W. Walnut Street

Visitor Parking is available in two different parking garages. One is located to the right as you turn onto W. Walnut Street and the other is to the left. W. Walnut Street is not a through street.

The Library is located in the Medical Research & Library Building which features six glass towers and is located on the south side of the street.

Welcome

The Library is the only academic health sciences library in the state, and is the primary information resource for faculty, staff, and students of the Indiana University School of Medicine, School of Nursing, School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences, and licensed Indiana health care professionals.

The Library is also open to anyone wishing to use its on-site facilities for scholarly and research activities. If a visit is planned for an evening or weekend, and you would like to be directed to specific resources, please contact the Education and Information Services Department in advance of your visit.

The Collection

The physical facility houses the largest medical book and journal collection in the state, and has over 50 computer workstations. The Library has a growing electronic collection of databases, books, and journals. Library users can expect to access the majority of these resources when visiting the library.

IUCAT is the on-line card catalog for the Indiana University Library system (all campuses) and can be used to check to see if books, journals and electronic resources are available at the Medical Library. IUCAT is accessible via the Library's web page.

The Indiana University Medical Library Special Collections emphasize the practice of 19th century medicine in Indiana and other Midwestern states. Call or e-mail in advance of your visit to assure that the Special Collections room is open.

Off-campus Use of the Collection

The Library has a virtual presence on the Internet at <http://www.medlib.iupui.edu> and anyone is welcome to visit the website. Due to contractual restrictions, remote access to some resources (some databases, books, and most electronic journals) is limited to individuals associated with the Indiana University School of Medicine, School of Nursing or the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences.

Borrowing Privileges

All Indiana University faculty, staff, and students are eligible to check out materials at the Library. Licensed Indiana Health Care Professionals are eligible to apply for a library card. A valid Indiana University identification card or Indiana health care professional license must be presented to the circulation desk staff in order to obtain a library card.

The Library does not accept Indiana Public Library Access Cards (PLAC). Circulation policies are available on the Library's website.

Indiana Citizens may access library services such as remote access to the OVID MEDLINE system, document delivery, and training by joining the Affiliates program. School of Medicine alumni are eligible for this program at a discounted rate. More information and an application form is available on the Library website.

Education and Information Services

Basic questions are answered by Library staff and medical librarians are on call Monday through Fridays from 9 am to 5 pm to assist with more in-depth questions.

Faculty librarians teach classes on a variety of topics, including: locating health information on the Internet, retrieving the best evidence literature, and information management using personal bibliographic software such as Endnote. Classes can be tailored to meet the curriculum needs of the School of Medicine, School of Nursing, and School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences. Time permitting, classes or tours may be arranged for individuals or groups not affiliated with the University.

To arrange for a session or to speak with a medical librarian, contact the Circulation Desk and ask to speak with the On-Call Librarian.

Photocopying & Printing

There is a charge for printing and copying in the Library. Copy cards may be purchased at the circulation desk. The Library has photocopy machines on all three floors of the facility in addition to centralized printing from computer stations.

Document Delivery Services

You may borrow materials not available on the IUPUI campus through Interlibrary Loan. Faculty, staff, and students of the Indiana University School of Medicine, School of Nursing, and School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences are eligible for this service at no charge (up to 100 requests, library subsidizes the cost). Other users are assessed a fee for each request.

Indiana University users and non-IU users may order copies from the library's collections for a fee through Document Delivery Services. Interlibrary Loan and Copy Service Policies and pricing are available on the Library's web site.
